

# Student Achievement Data

Florida Memorial University expects all its graduates to function in a highly competitive, technological, and global society. To this end, it evaluates student performance by measuring

- Freshman Retention
- Course Completion
- Student Performance on State Licensure Examinations
- Student Progression through a Prescribed Program in a Defined Timeline

- (1) The National Center for Educational Statistics defines the Full-time Freshman Retention Rate as the “percentage of first-time bachelors (or equivalent) degree-seeking undergraduates from the previous fall who are again enrolled in the current fall.” Note: This does not include part-time students. Data source: IPEDS report
- (2) Florida Memorial University defines Course Completion Rate as the percentage of students who earn a grade of C or higher in a course. Data source: Office of Institutional Research/Power Campus Report for Fall and Spring semesters
- (3) Data source: Florida Department of Education. Note: The pass rate is reported for the first attempt on all subtests.
- (4) Graduation Rate is defined as the percentage of students “entering the institution as full-time, first-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students in a particular year (cohort)... completing their program within 150 percent of normal time to completion.” In the case of regular four-year baccalaureate programs, this translates to six years.
