THE HISTORY

FLORIDA MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY

Florida Memorial University is the only historically Black university in South Florida. The university is the product of merging in 1941 two pre-existing institutions – Florida Baptist Institute, established by the Black Baptists of Florida in Live Oak, Fla., in 1879, and the Florida Baptist Academy, established in Jacksonville, Fla., in 1892, by the Reverend Matthew Gilbert, Reverend Jacob T. Brown, and Sarah Ann Blocker. Both institutions offered industrial education, domestic arts, teacher education, agricultural, mechanical, and religious training. These institutions were recipients of financial support from the Rockefeller General Education Board, Baptist organizations, the Bethany Association, and the American Home Mission Society.

In 1896, Nathan White Collier was appointed president of the Academy, a post he held for 45 years. President Collier recruited renowned composer and Jacksonville native, J. Rosamond Johnson, to teach music at the school. While in the employment of the Florida Baptist Academy, Rosamond composed music for “Lift Ev’ry Voice and Sing,” a poem written by his brother, James Weldon Johnson, creating the song that has since been enshrined as the “Negro National Anthem.” It was first performed by a choir that included students from Florida Baptist Academy at a celebration of Abraham Lincoln’s birthday in 1900. The song was adopted in 1919 by the NAACP as “The Negro National Anthem.”

In 1918, the institution was relocated to St. Augustine, Fla., where it remained until 1968. From 1924 to 1940, several new buildings and dormitories were built, and the name was changed to Florida Normal and Industrial Institute. In 1931, the school was accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the

Florida Department of Education. In 1963, the name was then changed to Florida Memorial College and the institution relocated to Miami Gardens, Fla., in 1968. The institution became Florida Memorial University (FMU) in December 2004, and currently offers 28 undergraduate degree programs, four graduate degree programs, and several professional programs. The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) fully accredit Florida Memorial University to offer baccalaureate and master degrees. Its academic programs are accredited by the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs, the Aviation Accreditation Board International, the Computing Accreditation Commission of ABET, the National Association of Schools of Music, and the Council on Social Work Education.

The first reference to the Lion as FMU’s mascot and orange as the University’s color was in 1929 in St. Augustine, Fla., At that time, the baseball and football teams were referred to as “The Lions on the St. Augustine campus.” The first time the orange and blue combination formally appeared was on the cover of the 1963-65 University Catalog. This coincided with the name change from Florida Normal and Industrial Institute to Florida Memorial College. The motto, “Leadership, Character and Service,” first appeared in earlier documents when the institution was relocated to Jacksonville, Fla.

Today, FMU is a culturally diverse institution, transforming lives and helping to create a future for people from many races, ethnicities, countries, religions, and socio-economic backgrounds. Strong moral character, mutual respect, freedom of worship, and a commitment to serve are the hallmarks of what it means to be a Florida Memorial Lion.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

HER EXCELLENCY SHARON LADY WILSON, K.C.



Her Excellency Ambassador Sharon Lady Wilson, K.C. is, by any measure, a nation builder whose distinguished career reflects decades of service to The Bahamas through education, law, public service, diplomacy, and faith.

Lady Wilson is a graduate of St. John's College in New Providence, The Bahamas. She went on to pursue tertiary studies in the United States, earning a Bachelor's Degree in Literature from Florida Memorial University and later a Master's Degree from the University of Miami.

Her professional journey began in education, where she served as a Language Arts teacher at the high school level for ten years, shaping the minds and aspirations of young Bahamians. She later pursued a career in law and was called to The Bahamas Bar, embarking on a judicial career that would span nearly two decades.

During her tenure in the judiciary, Lady Wilson served across all areas of magisterial jurisdiction. She played a pioneering role in the development of specialized courts in The Bahamas, organizing and serving as the first Magistrate of the Magistrate's Family Court. In the late 1980s, she was also appointed as the Magistrate in The Bahamas' first specialized Drug Court, helping to advance a more responsive and rehabilitative approach within the justice system.

In 1999, Lady Wilson founded the law firm Sharon Wilson & Co., where she continues to serve as Senior Partner. The firm represents a wide cross-section of clients, particularly in the area of Family Law, and has developed a strong specialization in Land Law. Lady Wilson has been involved in several landmark cases that have contributed significantly to the development of jurisprudence in land law in The Bahamas.

Her contributions to the legal profession were formally recognized in 2022, when she was awarded the distinguished honour of Queen's Counsel for excellence in the field of law.

Lady Wilson's service to the nation has also extended into parliamentary leadership. In 2002, she became a Member of Parliament and went on to serve two terms as President of the Senate of the Commonwealth of The Bahamas, making history as the only woman to date to have served twice in that role.

She also serves internationally as a member of the Diplomatic Corps of The Bahamas, holding the post of Non-resident Ambassador to the United Mexican States.

A woman of strong faith, Lady Wilson is an active member of the Anglican Church community. She has served for many years on the Vestry of St. Barnabas Church and has represented the Diocese at several sessions of the Provincial Synod throughout the Caribbean.

Over the course of her distinguished career, Lady Wilson has received numerous honours and accolades for her contributions to national development and public service. She has often remarked that while she is grateful for these recognitions, she finds even greater fulfilment in having had the opportunity to contribute meaningfully to the lives of others.
